The following made-for-television films all contain original scores by John Barry, none of which have been recorded on a soundtrack album. "The Gathering", "The War Between The Tates", Young Joe The Forgotten Kennedy" and "Eleanor and Franklin - The White House Years", the follow-up to 1976 well received award winner "Eleanor and Franklin". All were premiered on American television last year and are so far unshown in this country except "The War Between The Tates", which has played in a few regions..."La Machine", a recent US television commercial has music by Barry, it is in fact the music he wrote in 1967 for a British TV commercial "Wool" which is still shown over here. "The Girl With The Sun In Her Hair" and "Rowntrees Black Magic Chocolates" are others still on view.

Success

Record sales for the single Deep Down Inside', sung by Donna Summer from the film "The Deep" amounted to 250,000 copies in Great Britain alone earning Barry a silver disc. The sound-track album was also very successful commercially, entering many album charts world wide... To put the record straight John Williams was never assigned to score the picture as previously reported in various publications, but he will be returning to the sea with the score for Jaws II.
